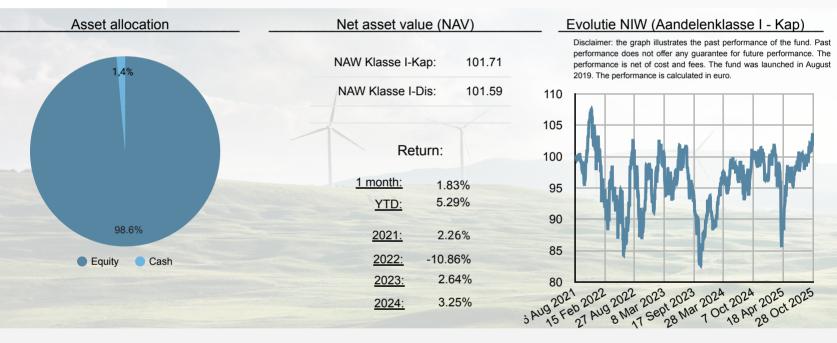
Econopolis Climate Fund

Description of the funds

Econopolis Climate Fund s is a compartment of Econopolis Funds SICAV, a Luxembourg UCITS funds. The fund aims to deliver a long term return to investors via investments in equity instruments that deliver climate solutions. Econopolis Climate Fund is aimed at investors with an investor horizon of more than 5 years. SFDR classification: Article 8 Fund.

Manager Comments

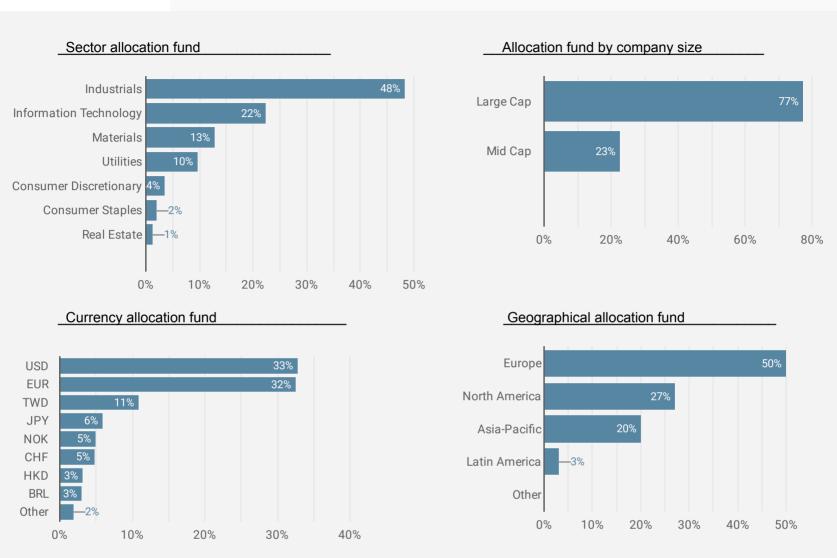
The compartment closed October with a positive return of +1.83 %, bringing the year-to-date performance to +5,29 %. Climate investments are increasingly viewed as a strategic necessity for regions seeking greater resilience. As the moral narrative of climate action — focused on CO₂ reduction for future generations - gives way to one of self-reliance, global cooperation faces challenges from geopolitical tensions. Regions are therefore focusing more on energy independence and security, emphasising local renewable energy, recycling, grid investments, and reduced import dependency. A narrative based on self-interest and regional autonomy appears to drive more effective action than purely moral appeals. Since its inception, the managers have focused on these themes of resilience and circularity, positioning the compartment as a pioneer in the transition toward a more localised, sustainable economy. During October, the managers initiated new positions in GE Vernova and First Solar, while taking profits on Delta Electronics, Chroma Ate, Iberdrola, and Johnson Controls. They also reduced holdings in Veolia, Weyerhaeuser, and Linde. Top contributors were Chroma Ate, Delta Electronics, and Metso, while Linde, A.O. Smith, and Waste Management detracted. At month-end, assets under management totalled €96.5 million, with allocations as follows: Renewable Energy: 39.6 % Sustainable Transport: 6.1 % Energy-efficient Infrastructure: 31.7 % Circular Economy: 14.5 % Emission Capture: 4.7 % Sustainable Agriculture & Food: 3.5 % Investment in Focus - GE Vernova GE Vernova Inc. (NYSE: GEV) was spun off from General Electric in April 2024 and now operates independently, employing 75,000 people in over 100 countries. The group focuses on electrification and decarbonisation across three main divisions: Power (52 % of revenue) - Gas, steam, and nuclear turbines with over 20 % EBITDA growth in 2024. Wind (20 %) - Onshore and offshore turbines, showing improved margins and reduced losses. Electrification (28 %) - High-voltage networks and transmission equipment, with orders up 19 % and a tripled backlog. In 2024, GE Vernova delivered 29 GW of low-carbon capacity, helping clients avoid about 20 million tonnes of CO2 emissions



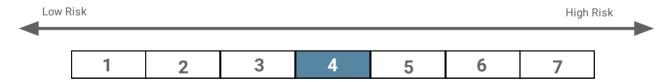

Investment objectives:

The sub-fund's objective is to offer investors, through an actively managed portfolio, long-term capital gains on their investment. The sub-fund must hold at least 90% of its net assets in equities. The sub-fund will invest in equities and other equity instruments of companies operating in developed markets (such as, but not limited to Europe, the United States and Japan) and may also invest in companies operating in emerging markets. The universe of the sub-fund has been constructed with a view to selecting companies whose business model is focused on providing solutions or parts of solutions, or which have adapted their business model to meet increasing climate change challenges. There are no restrictions or limitations in terms of currencies or geographical regions. The Investment Manager's choices are discretionary and reflect its expectations and strategic views. Investment selection is based on ongoing financial evaluations, analysis of the macroeconomic environment and the specific profile of the issuer, future developments, etc. The sub-fund's investment policy is based on three cornerstones in stock selection: a disciplined multi-step approach in the Investment Manager's research and analysis, a unique non-marketed philosophy and the importance of on-site research. Investments are based on conviction rather than benchmarks: conviction in themes, conviction in countries and conviction in companies. The sub-fund may invest in derivative financial products, such as futures, options, forward foreign exchange contracts, credit default swaps or interest rate swaps, to achieve its investment objectives and to hedge risks.
